The contractor will be placing concrete curb and driveway aprons for both driveways on 6<sup>th</sup> Street on Monday, June 21. Both driveway accesses adjacent to 6<sup>th</sup> Street (including the underground parking) will be closed starting Monday, June 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:00 a.m. You will not be able to get in or out of these two driveways until approximately 3 days following the concrete placement. You will still have access to the parking lot on the north side from Cook Avenue.

Affected residents should have any cars, trucks, boats, etc. that you will need for the next 3 days out of your driveway and garage. Please park these vehicles on the street outside of the construction zone.

- **After the driveway and/or apron has been placed you will NOT be able to use your driveway for three (3) days after concrete is poured, or until the contractor has ramped your driveway with gravel.**
- **You WILL be able to park in the street during the evenings after 7:00 p.m.**
- **All vehicles parked on the street need to be moved to a side street away from the construction area at the beginning of each workday (7:00 a.m.).**

**SAFETY REMINDER!!** Due to heavy truck traffic and general construction activity, we would ask all parents to inform and make their children aware of the dangers of construction sites and to keep their children a safe distance from all construction areas. Your support and cooperation in assisting us to maintain a safe work zone and cautioning children about the dangers of construction sites will be appreciated.

Also, please **DO NOT walk through the active construction site during working hours.** The Contractor is trying to move as quickly as possible through the construction process and any non-work related pedestrian traffic can cause delays and safety issues.
