**Weather pending**, Lino Lakes Landscaping will begin to lay sod on the boulevards on 10<sup>th</sup> Street (from Highway 61 to Alley), 11<sup>th</sup> Street (from Highway 61 to Johnson Avenue), Morehead Avenue (from 11<sup>th</sup> Street to Highway 96) and Alleys (from 10<sup>th</sup> Street to Highway 96) starting Friday, June 15, 2018.

## **QUICK TIPS FOR CARING FOR NEW SOD**

Help maintain your new sod by following these simple guidelines:

- New sod requires 1 to 2 inches of water a week for the roots to take hold. The contractor will
  water the sod and is responsible for the sod warranty <u>for 30 days after installation</u>. However,
  if the weather turns dry or you notice your sod drying out, we ask that you please take the time
  to water it. Remember to comply with the City's irrigation ban (see below).
- After the contractor's 30 day warranty, the sod becomes the responsibility of the homeowner.
- Test for established roots by attempting to pull up an edge of the sod. If it pulls up easily, give
  it more time and continue watering one to two inches per week. If the sod edge does not come
  up, the roots have taken hold.
- Once the roots are established, water about one inch per week, which is the minimum amount needed to keep a lawn healthy and thriving.
- Do NOT mow the new sod for at least two weeks, and then not until the roots are established.
- After the roots are established, cut it at the HIGHEST setting on your mower throughout this
  growing season. The grass can then gradually be cut to the desired length, but not until next
  spring. The contractor will not replace sod that is damaged by residents mowing too soon
  or excessively short. If you question whether or not to mow, please err on the side of caution
  and wait.
- Fertilizing should not be necessary until next spring. Helping provide the water and care your sod needs will reduce time and money spent to replace dead sod.
- Lawn irrigation using the City's water supply is prohibited between the hours of 10:00 AM and 5:00 PM through September 30<sup>th</sup>.
