SUBJECT: Construction Update

City Project Nos.: 17-06 and 18-01

For **Project Area 18-01**, topsoil and sod was placed on 10th Street, 11th Street, and Morehead Avenue (north of 11th Street) and the alleys north of 10th Street. Pavement removal on the alleys, 10th Street, Morehead Avenue and Johnson Avenue continued. Aggregate base was started on 8th and 9th Street and completed on Johnson Avenue from 10th Street to 7th Street. Newly placed sod is maintained by the Contractor for 30 days. Please watch for a flyer regarding watering the sod after the 30 day window.

Next week, utility work continues on Morehead Avenue, Johnson Avenue, 8^{th} , 9^{th} and 10^{th} Streets and in the alleys. Curb and gutter on Johnson Avenue is still out about 2 weeks. Final asphalt placement on 11^{th} Street will be held off to avoid unnecessary construction traffic wear and tear.

Please advise visitors that the neighborhood is an active work zone and to use caution while walking or driving through the site. The Contractor is going to get the site as clean as possible for the parade and beach dance, but if possible please use alternative routes and avoid the work site altogether. Direct visitors to use the sidewalk on 11th Street or the south side of 7th Street to walk towards the lake trail.

For **Project Area 17-06** (Old White Bear Avenue), the aggregate base and first layer of asphalt were placed, as were the foundations for light pole bases.

The City is working with Comcast to possibly remove some of their overhead lines to reduce the thickness to about 1/3 of what is today. The lines may also be raised slightly as they are drooping too low and might interfere with the new light poles.
