TO:	Residents on 9 th Street, Morehead Avenue and 10 th Street

Weather permitting, curb and gutter replacement will begin starting at 6:00 am on Friday, June 29th on Ninth Street (from Stewart Avenue to Johnson Avenue), Morehead Avenue (from 9th to 10th Street) and 10th Street (from Morehead Avenue to Johnson Avenue). You will not be able to get in or out of your driveway from when curb is placed until the contractor has ramped your driveway with gravel, which is approximately 5 days following the curb placement.

Affected residents should have any cars, trucks, boats, etc. that you will need for the next five days out of your driveway and garage. Please park these vehicles on the street outside of the construction zone.

- After the curb and gutter has been placed you will NOT be able to use your driveway for five (5) days after concrete is poured, or until the contractor has ramped your driveway with gravel.
- You WILL be able to park in the street during the evenings after 7:00 p.m., taking extreme care not to hit the newly placed curb.
- All vehicles parked on the street need to be moved to a side street away from the construction area at the beginning of each workday (7:00 a.m.).

* Residents in alleys from Johnson Avenue to the east will also be affected.

DRIVEWAY OPENINGS

One or two days prior to pouring the curb, will be marking your driveway openings with small white stakes. These stakes indicate the proposed extents of the curb opening (lowest "drive-able" portion of the curb). **See picture at left.** Generally, this will be the same width of your existing driveway. For homeowners changing the width through our driveway replacement program, we will mark the curb opening at the proposed new width.

All driveways will also include a three-foot wing on each side (as shown in the pictures below) which slopes up to match the full height of the curb.
