This volunteer program puts regular citizens on the street, in uniform, to supplement the White Bear Lake Police Department.

The Police Reserves work directly with sworn police officers, enhancing safety in our community.

Reserve officers do not carry firearms and do not have the authority to make arrests, but they do serve in critical roles that enhance the work of White Bear Lake's sworn police officers.

The unit is also subject to community callouts and special details, such as community events and providing additional security following natural disasters.
